WATERLOO AWAITS OUR ARRIVAL!

The Greater Cedar Valley USBC and the city of Waterloo anxiously await the arrival of our bowlers entered in the 2008 ISUSBCWBA 2nd Annual State Tournament.

The tournament kick-off is set for Saturday, Feb. 9, 2008 and will begin with a Youth Singles Tournament. Following the Youth tournament, the official Opening Ceremony will be held at 10:30 and the tournament bowling will then begin at 11:00 am.

Our 2008 tournament fielded 953 team entries, 2,313 doubles, 4,626 singles, and 4,392 all events. Scheduled bowling will conclude on Sunday, June 1, 2008 as the tournament was extended by one weekend. Five 4:00 pm Sunday squads were also added to accommodate all the entries we possibly could schedule! Many thanks to all those bowlers who were so flexible with their scheduling! If you're reading this, and you're not entered in the state tournament and would like to bowl, please contact me and I'll put you on a list of potential substitutes, there is always a need for subs!

Greater Cedar Valley USBC is planning brackets and a 50/50 each squad of the tournament, you won't want

to miss out on that! They'll also have a variety of items available at their concessions table. The ISUSBCWBA is offering a raffle for 6 kitchen items, all pink in color, for the benefit of the Komen Foundation; and also a raffle for a bowling ball, for the BVL!

When checking in at the tournament office, you'll find a variety of our past membership and trading pins available for purchase, along with our 20 Year Calendars!

Thank you to all you association managers who promptly reported the Dec. 1 averages that I requested. Our list of entrants without a 2006-07 average was a little over 400. Receiving the requested averages from the Association Managers timely is very helpful. Thanks also for all the help extended to the state office in verifying memberships. That also is a time consuming effort and the help from the locals is vital!

Association Managers, just a short reminder to submit your Deceased Member report, either on the provided purple form or by email by February 15th. These departed members will be honored during our Memorial Service on Sunday of Annual Meeting weekend.

Does your association have a president, association manager (past secretary-treasurer) or treasurer who served your association for

10 consecutive years? If so, please submit her name to the state office, the ISUSBCWBA presents an award to these dedicated individuals at the annual meeting.

What's new since our last chat? November and December are busy months scheduling the state tournament, organizing the score monitor school, re-doing the various forms, starting to pack the supplies needed at the tournament for scoring and the office and even starting on the tournament form for 2009 in Cedar Rapids! ANNUAL IOWA 600 CLUB DOUBLES & SINGLES TOURNAMENT

The 2007 edition of the Iowa 600 Club Doubles & Singles Tournament was held in October at Spare Time Lanes in Jefferson. The doubles event had 61 doubles entries, 118 singles entries, 115 all events/handicap entries, and 85 all events/scratch entries, with 13 different associations represented.

The doubles crown was claimed by Elaine Hess and Joan Welsch (Greenfield USBC WBA) with a total score of 1500. 2nd place went to Carri Danker (Fort Dodge USBC WBA) and Brenda McWhorter (Gr. Mason City USBC) with a score of 1419, 3rd place went to Vickie Woodford and Shannon McHugh (Greene County USBC) with a score of 1395, and a tie for 4th place went to Maxine Whitmore (Stuart USBC WBA) and Willa Dwinell (Greene County USBC), and Lynn Burns and Kelli Patterson (Des Moines Area USBC WBA) both with a score of 1390.

The singles crown was captured by Joan Welsch (Greenfield USBC WBA) with an 798 handicap series. Angela Eastwood (Fort Dodge USBC WBA) finished 2nd with a score of 784, 3rd place went to Kelli Patterson (Des Moines Area USBC WBA) with a 780, 4th place went to Carri Danker (Fort Dodge USBC WBA) with a score of 768, and rounding out the top 5 was Alesia Ridenour (Fort Dodge USBC WBA) with a score of 755.

Carri Danker captured the all events/handicap title with a total score of 1529. Joan Welsch was second with a total handicap score of 1522, Elaine Hess was third with a total handicap score of 1498, Cari McPartland (Ames Area USBC) was fourth with a score of 1465, and rounding out the top 5 was Kelli Patterson with a total handicap score of 1452.

This year's tournament also had an all events/scratch event for the first time. Cari McPartland won the all events scratch title with a score of 1309, Lisa Lihs - 2nd, 1230 (Des Moines Area USBC WBA), Sue Boals - 3rd, 1221 (Des Moines Area USBC WBA), Sharon Tollefson - 4th, 1217 (Cedar Rapids USBC), and Sandy Irish - 5th, 1197 (Des Moines Area USBC WBA).

In the doubles event the high individual scratch game was a 246 shot by McPartland, and the high individual scratch game in the singles event was a 267 rolled by Boals. The high scratch doubles game was shot by Barb Smith and Kelly Wagner of 416 (Fort Dodge USBC WBA). The high scratch doubles series was 1115 and was rolled by Teri Jennings and McPartland (Ames Area USBC).

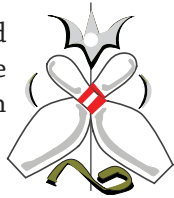
Heard Around the State

The Iowa State USBC Women's Bowling Association, Inc. sponsors an annual tournament for our senior members. In order to be eligible to participate in this event, you must be 55 years of age on May 1, 2008, and willing to admit it!

The tournament has two divisions, by age, not average! Division 1 is for ages 65 and older for Singles and All Events, combined ages of 130 and over for Doubles. Division 2 is for the "younger" set, for Singles & All Events, ages 55 to 64, and for Doubles, combined ages of 110 to 129.

The 2008 tournament is being held in New Hampton, IA at Bowlaway Lanes, 2177 McCloud Ave. The tournament dates are May 3rd, 4th, 10th, 17, & 18th, 2008. There is no bowling on Mother's Day.

Entry fee is \$13.00 per person per event. Optional All Events fee is \$2.00.

The Iowa State USBC Women's Bowling Association, Inc. awards a variety of awards, once per lifetime.

300 Game

The ISUSBCWBA awards a first 300 game award to our members. A plaque in the shape of Iowa, properly engraved, is awarded at the ISUSBCWBA annual meeting. The recipient is invited to attend the annual meeting to accept the award and our congratulations.

700 Series

When one of our members has her first USBC certified 700 series, we award a very nice 700 Series Award pin. Her name and accomplishment are also recorded in the Annual Report Book and will also be published in the Iowa WBA Bowler, our official newsletter.

800 Series

When one of our members has her first certified USBC 800 series, we award a plaque in the shape of Iowa, appropriately engraved, and awarded at our annual meeting. The recipient is invited to our annual meeting for the presentation. The honoree's name is recorded in the Annual Report Book and also published in the newsletter.

275 or Higher Game

A very attractive award pin is issued to our members rolling their first USBC certified 275 or higher game, one per lifetime. Their name and accomplishment are also recorded in the Annual Report Book and in the newsletter.

Although these awards are presented as once per lifetime, the state office still needs to be notified when these scores are rolled so they can be recognized in the newsletter! League secretaries, please make sure and report these accomplishments to your local association manager who will in turn, notify the state office. When awards are issued, they are mailed to the local association manager to be presented at an appropriate time, except those as noted above.



Hall of Fame

The Hall of Fame inductees are nominated by their local association, member or other persons, and are selected through a committee comprised of the ISUSBCWBA Board of Directors. The decision of the Hall of Fame committee is then presented to the entire Board of Directors of the ISUSBCWBA for approval. Forms are available on the ISUSBCWBA website, iowawba.com or from your local association manager, or by contacting the state office.

Outstanding Manager Award

The Outstanding Manager Award, appropriately named, is to honor an outstanding local association manager who well serves their local association and fulfills the duties and requests of the state office. The award is selected from nominees submitted by their local associations by a committee of the ISUSBCWBA with approval from the

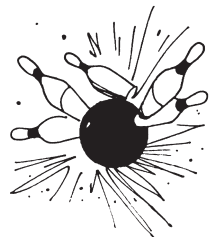
Board of Directors. The nomination form is available on the website, iowawba.com, or from your local association President, or by contacting the state office.

Above & Beyond Award

This relatively new award is a combination of our previous Elaine Rasmussen Spirit Award, and the Virg VanDierendonck Friendship Award. This award is presented to a deserving person who demonstrates dedication and service to the sport of bowling and USBC members. The recipient may or may not be a member of the Iowa State USBC WBA. He or she should embrace the same goals and ideals as the Iowa State USBC WBA Board of Directors. The award also uses a nomination system; the form is on the website, in the office of the local association managers, or by contacting the state office. The nominations are reviewed by the awards committee and approved by the Board of Directors.

First 300 Game for Duenow

Bowling – the Fastest Growing High School Sport of the Decade

High school bowling participation numbers are up again, showing that it is the fastest growing high school sport of the decade.



The numbers were up 6 percent in the 2006-07 season, moving it past ice hockey, according to the newest National Federation of State High School Associations participation survey.

The 19 states offering high school varsity bowling had a combined 45,064 participants, up 6 percent from the 42,482 who participated in 2005-06, and passing ice hockey which had 43,505 participants.

The number of students participating is more than twice the 20,096 who participated in the decade's first full season in 2000-01. The number of schools nearly tripled as there were boys competing in 828 schools and girls in 898 that first season. The number offering varsity competition for the 2006-07 season were 2,137 schools with 23,705 boys' participants and 2,053 schools with 21,359 girls' participants.

Sixteen states offering both boys and girls varsity bowling in 2006-07 were Alaska, Arkansas, Florida, Hawaii, Illinois, Kansas, Louisiana, Michigan, Mississippi, New Mexico, Nevada, New

Jersey, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania and Tennessee. Iowa and Washington have only girls' varsity bowling, and Minnesota has a program of adaptive bowling for students with physical or cognitive disabilities.

Iowa has been involved in both boys' and girls' high school bowling since the inaugural 2000-01 season, first under the guidance of the Iowa High School Bowling Federation and now, in its second season, as an officially sanctioned sport for girls by the Iowa Girls High School Athletic Union. Boys' teams continue to compete under the guidance of the Iowa High School Bowling Federation.

A story by Brandon Cleaver in the Des Moines Register in December says Iowa girls' bowling is here to stay, and in its second year as a sanctioned sport, has increased from 48 teams to 61. He continues by saying the Iowa High School Athletic Association has had informal discussions on sanctioning boys' bowling, but have no plans to do so in the near future.

Meanwhile, girls' varsity bowling continues to grow. Eight of the schools who have sanctioned this season are West Des Moines Valley, Ankeny, Johnston, Marshalltown, Ottumwa, Mason City, Urbandale, and Waukee. With the addition of these schools, reclassification was necessary to place

the top 24 schools with the largest enrollment in Class 2-A, and all others in Class 1-A.

High school competition is not a stroll in the park. Just this season, in the Cedar Rapids area alone, the competition is heating up. One month into the season, the Cedar Rapids Kennedy Cougar girls were undefeated at 4-0, had been out-scoring their opponents by an average of 600 pins per match, and had a SCRATCH per-game average of 2,709. Their top bowler averages 200, a sophomore on the team averages 190, the other three regular members of the team have averages of 171 and above, and their substitute sixth bowler averages just over 166.

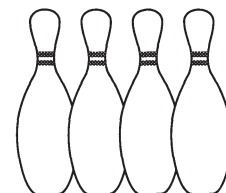
In just a few short weeks (Feb. 16), regional playoffs will take place to determine who will advance to state competition in Des Moines on Feb. 23. For some of the best bowling you might ever see, be sure to attend a regional event near you.

So, as Mr. Cleaver so cleverly stated: "Iowa girls' bowling is here to stay." And why not? These girls have discovered bowling is right up their alley.
